KEEP IT GROWING

Following the nominating convention, John Goodson, our gubernatorial candidate, has been the subject of several objective news stories - both Goodson and the NJLP have received a number of letters concerning libertarianism and the party, and membership is growing slowly but steadily. Also, informal contact with some of Sandman's staff indicates that, should Sandman fail to receive the Republican nomination, they would vote for the Libertarian candidate, rather than for Cahill or the American Party candidate.

A tally of those present at the March 24th meeting revealed that, so far, we have about 450 of the 800 signatures required to get Goodson on the ballot. But over 400 of those signatures were collected by just five of the members. If we do not do the work to get our ideas across and provide a libertarian alternative, then all the statists who are willing to do the work will keep on succeeding, unchallenged. If you want to see something happen, don't expect someone else to do it for you – do it yourself (a very libertarian idea). Understand that you are doing noone but yourself a favor by getting signatures. Understand also that we may as well bury our heads for a year if we don't get on the ballot.

Convention Details

The Ohio LP has reserved space for the national convention at the Holiday Inn, I-71 and State Route 82, Strongsville, Ohio, 44136, (216)238-8800 Registration will begin at 6:00 pm, June 7th, in the lobby of the Inn. Convention sessions will be held all day, June 8th & 9th. There will be a National ExecComm meeting on June 10th, with anyone welcome to attend as an observer. Details on these and all social activities will be forthcoming as plans are finalized.

Convention room rates, per day, are as follows: Single occupancy, \$16, Double occupancy, \$20. Multiple occupancy add \$3 per person to \$20 rate. Rates do not include the 4% Ohio tax.

The Inn is only seven months old. It is one mile north of the Ohio Turn-pike (Exit #10), and only 10 miles from Cleveland-Hopkins airport. Facilities include color TV in every room, indoor/outdoor pool, hydrotherapeutic pool and saunas. Credit cards accepted are: Gulf Oil, American Express, Diner's Club, Master Charge and Bank Americard.

Several years ago, the Beatles recorded a song entitled "Ticket to Ride". The song became a hit and the lyrics are still well known. One recurring couplet from the song might serve as a warning to our party. The couplet reads- "she's got a ticket to ride, but she don't care!"

The ticket to ride is the \$7.50 membership fee to NJLP. \$7.50 is a cheap price for another political organization to pay to infiltrate and possibly disrupt our fledgling party. The fact that someone, anyone in our 43 member party has paid \$7.50 does not automatically qualify them as true libertarians and earn them our trust. We must look deeper.

The second half of the couplet reads— "but she don't care." How can we, the true libertarians, recognize the wolves? Some wolves will wear the sheep's (libertarian's) clothing and will be very difficult to detect. But what about those who are blatantly wolves?— those who would have us compromise our principles? These wolves are plainly visible to those with open eyes. They are not purist libertarians and do not believe only in our party. They, for motives not yet clear, would have us sell our party down the river before it even gets established.

Those who advocate the principles of more than one party are a total disservice to either party. I strongly urge no support for those of us who show dual alliances.

Soon you, too, will recognize that "they got their tickets to ride- but they don't care!"
