LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN by John S. Schafer

The State of Nebraska has declared war upon some of its own people. Seven male parents are in jail serving indeterminate terms for contempt of court, although not charged with any crime. Their wives, 12 children and pastor have fled across the state line to Iowa.

What is the great, burning issue that has brought down the wrath of the state upon these peaceful citizens? They have enrolled their children in a tiny Christian school of the Faith Baptist Church, Louisville, Nebraska, in which the teachers have not completed state-required courses in educational

theory. When the local Cass County judge refused to take any action, an outside judge was brought in, promptly threw the 7 men in jail, and then went off on his Thanksgiving vacation!

The outside judge has instructed the Cass County prosecutor that two legal defenses will not be permitted to be heard in his court: religious freedom under the bill of rights; or the standard achievement scores of the children (which are higher than public school children). It is intended to be a railroad show trial, engineered by a power-hungry judge, conducted by the Nebraska Education Association, and dispatched by the tax-supported complex of government schools and teacher training colleges.

A small breath of liberty is about to be snuffed out in Nebraska by an organized tyranny no different than the KGB swinging clubs against worshippers of God in Russia. Can this be happening in America? Wake up! It can, it is happening, to you and to me and to every free American who stands idly by and does nothing.

Hundreds of pastors have flown into Louisville at their own expense to keep the school operating. They intend to fill all the jail cells in Cass County and any temporary barracks and even tents, if it should come to that. Contributions are needed to fight back. \$10 brings a packet of documented materials, while \$100 brings "the most appalling videotape you've ever seen" -- X-Rated Tyranny. "And who, I ask you, would listen? For in the miraculous spontaneity of the sun, there is discipline that utterly escapes you, and a knowledge beyond any that we know. And in the spontaneous playing of the bees from flower to flower, there is a discipline beyond any that you know, and laws that follow their own knowledge, and joy that is beyond command. For true discipline, you see, is found only in spontaneity. Spontaneity knows its own order."

### STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

The NJLP Steering Committee met for 2 1/2 hours at Schafer's on January 21, 1984. Present were Schafer, George, Flynn, Maiullo, and Heller; Pope and Rehmke were absent.

Jane Rehmke does not wish to seek reelection as NJLP treasurer, so Rick Hoegberg volunteered to work on transfer of the NJLP mailing/membership list to his personal computer for future maintenance. The treasurer's position is open to any NJLP member; anyone interested in the office should call John Schafer.

The Committee noted that national LP increased dues to \$15 annually, effective January 1, 1984. A motion passed unanimously to notify the membership of this fact and tell NJLP members that dues changes will be proposed at the NJLP convention (3/23-24/84).

The NJLP convention report by Bill George was unanimously accepted along with approval of \$661.45 in expense checks for it. Bill noted that introducers for three speakers are needed; they will receive free admission to the particular session or a rebate.

Steve Friedlander distributed a draft NJLP brochure for comment. Steve also reported on candidate recruitment and will chair Screening Committee consisting of himself, Dan Maiullo, Len Flynn, lick Siano. The Steering Committee passed unanimously a motion to request, at Screening Committee discretion, that each prospective NJLP candidate sign this statement: "I have read and understand the Libertarian Party platform. Any reservations I have are listed below."

The Steering Committee voted unanimously to set aside \$200 for outreach information and education for candidates but not for personal campaign use. Steve will administer this effort.

# Kingwood Committeeman Hurt In Crash

Kingwood Township Committeeman Richard Siano, injured in an auto accident in Flemington at noon Monday, remained in serious condition yesterday at Hunterdon Medical Center.

Siano, 45, suffered multiple injuries including a broken collar bone and lung damage when his car was struck by a tractor-trailer that ran a red light, police said.

"When I saw him, it was a shock; but when I saw the car — it's a miracle he's alive," his wife, Sandy, said afterward.

Patrolman Mark Chipps said the trucker, Eric Belmudes, 24, of Bloomington, Cal., was headed north on Route 202-31 and Siano was

crossing the highway on Reaville Avenue. The trucker told the officer he was in the fast lane, checking his mirror to see if it was safe to turn into the slow lane when he looked up and saw the light was red.

Belmudes swerved left in an attempt to go through the cut in the median and avoid a collision, but the trailer hit the car, police said.

The truck then jumped the divider on the north side of the intersection, Chipps said, and struck a car and a bus headed south on Route 202-31. The bus, from Brooklyn and carrying persons to a funeral in Pennsylvania, was stopped at the time. Nobody on it reported any injuries, Chipps said.

The car, driven by Andrew Fendrock, 24, of Mount Arlington, was just coming to a stop when it was hit head-on. Fendrock was not hurt and his passenger was slightly injured but refused treatment, Chipps said. The truck driver, who was not hurt, was charged with failing to stop for a red light.

Siano was trapped in his car, a Volkswagen Rabbit. Flemington-Raritan Rescue Squad removed him, and the borough fire company responded because fuel spilled, Chipps said.


Siano, elected to the township committee in 1981, was the first Libertarian Party member to be elected to a contested office in the continental United States.
