## The "Paper Candidate" Issue Re-Visited

I'd like to respond to the letters of Ronald K. Wishart and Elizabeth Macron.

Ron first. Ron advocates a policy of Libertarians running "paper" candidates for congress and assembly in order to keep the Libertarian name in the public's eye and mind. It's funny though, that while he advocates such a policy for the party, he personally does not run, but feels that he contributes more to freedom by serving on a local zoning board. This is a case of do as I say not as I do. *But if serving at the local level is good enough for Ron, why not for the rest of us? I believe Ron has chosen the correct path, and I believe that as a party we need to follow his example rather than his advice.*

Elizabeth Macron's letter is well written and compel-

ling. But it has so many false assumptions in it that I find it necessary to spend the remainder of my space addressing them.

Liz starts out by saying that you aren't a political party if you don't run candidates. *Sure, but running candidates that never win doesn't make you a political party either.*

She points out that a "reluctant candidate" on late night television won in spite of himself. *But relying on flukes is not a long term strategy.*

Liz claims that a paper candidate will benefit from "spill-over votes" from "real" candidates, and I hope she is correct. *But what if the truth is that "paper" candidates rob credibility from the "real" candidates?*

She claims that the number of Libertarian votes cast im-

presses the press and public, and that this is beyond dispute. *Yes, but does it impress them positively or negatively? Surely no one believes that Andre Marrou's vote totals are wow-ing anyone?*

Liz claims that Libertarians elected to office will think for themselves. But she admonishes us not to "re-debate what has been considered, analyzed, understood and explained by the greatest libertarian thinkers of the ages.... Playing into and by the rules

of the political plunderers is a fatal mistake." *Which is it? Should libertarians think for themselves, or should they "not re-debate?"*

In my view adopting the principles of the Republic-rats is to be avoided at all costs, but if we want to win we must learn how to play and win by their rules. We don't have the option to change the rules until and unless we win. Why

## Meeting of the N.J. Libertarian Party Steering Committee of April 17, 1994

The chairman called the meeting to order at his house at 1:25 PM. Present: Layman, Flynn, Ellett, Stefanelli, Campbell, Grindlinger and Paff. Absent: Muentz.

The minutes of the March Steering Committee meeting were accepted; the treasurer's report was received.

### Old business.

**Federal campaigns.** Grindlinger, Senate, Roselle, 2d district and Bacon, 5th district, have submitted their petitions and will be on the ballot in November.

**Meeting with Gov. Whitman.** Sam Perelli, UTNJ, is working on a meeting between Layman and the governor's aides.

**Liberty Campaign Workshop.** RESOLVED, that the NJLP spend no more than \$230 total in scholarships for two attendees. PASSED.

### Committee Reports.

**By-laws implementation.** The Steering Committee went over line by line the draft "Election Rules and Procedure for [Selecting] NJLP State Board

County Representatives". The procedures and nomination form for county representative will be included with the next newsletter.

**Membership.** Campbell reported on two Operation Politically Homeless events, one at Ocean County Community College, the other at a computer fair at Mercer County Community College. On April 26 an organizational meeting of a Libertarian Club is planned at OCCC.

**Fund raising.** Muentz absent; no report.

**CATV Show.** Ellett has asked the counties to contact their local CATV stations about running Shad Woolley's "Third Point of View". At least one county, Ocean, is taking action. Mercer is showing reruns and needs new shows. RESOLVED, that the NJLP authorize the expenditure of \$100 for the reproduction of critically important CATV tapes, to be determined by the coordinator. PASSED.

**Media relations and publicity.** Paff is going to meet with local reporters and the Associated Press to determine if there is some way to obtain current topics from state officials and the state

AP wire so that we can respond the same day that news breaks. He urges county parties to purchase fax/modem software and develop a strategy for getting local coverage. He will also determine whether the daily newspapers will carry Libertarian columnists such as Vin Suprinowicz.

**Electoral strategy.** Layman has mailed to county chairs a listing of municipalities whose elections fit the criteria of being winnable.

### New business.

**Insurance coverage.** Some counties, such as Monmouth County, require vendors at fairs to carry a \$500,000 comprehensive general liability insurance policy. Flynn contacted the Advocates for Self-Government who will provide coverage on three conditions: 1) that no LP literature be displayed at the OPH booth, 2) that two Advocates sponsors contribute \$100 each, 3) that all names be turned over to them, and 4) that, in

order to comply with the terms of the policy, that no more than eight people man the booth. Therefore the Steering Committee RESOLVED, that the NJLP spend no more than \$250 for a \$500,000 comprehensive general liability policy. PASSED. — Flynn will invite an insurance agent to a future meeting to discuss additional insurance needs the NJLP might have.

### Announcements.

**Local campaigns.** Robert Heitner is running for freeholder in Sussex county; and Scott Derby is running for county clerk in Cumberland county.

**Second Amendment.** The NJLP will meet with the Coalition of N.J. Sportsmen May 12.

**Next meeting.** The Steering Committee will meet May 15 at a location to be selected by Stefanelli.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:34 PM.

## Meeting of the N.J. Libertarian Party Steering Committee of May 15, 1994

The vice chairman called the meeting to order at Liz Macron's house at 1:23 PM. Present: Flynn, Ellett, Stefanelli, Macron (for Campbell) and Paff. Absent: Grindlinger, Layman and Muentz.

The minutes of the April Steering Committee meeting were accepted; the treasurer's report was received.

### Committee Reports.

#### By-laws implementation.

The State Board is being formed now. Nominating procedures for selecting county representatives were published in the March/April newsletter. Nominations are due to the secretary by May 31.

**Membership.** Ocean County Community College has formed a Libertarian Club. The national LP has been asked to advise the group on furthering its goals.

**Fund raising.** Muentz will provide the chairman with a telephonic report the week of May 16.

**CATV Show.** Two counties (Monmouth and Mercer) are showing "A Third Point of View". Three (Ocean, Gloucester and Morris) are actively pursuing the matter. One (Middlesex) will discuss it at their next meeting. One (Sussex) will pursue it. The coordinator has follow up calls in to the remaining counties. Flynn, the latest guest on the show, recently did three segments on the environment.

**Media relations and publicity.** RESOLVED, that the NJLP reimburse John Paff \$27.99 for LP press releases faxed to N.J. media outlets.

**PASSED.**—Paff reported that access to the state AP wire costs between \$800-\$1000 per month; cost aside, we have no one to prepare press releases even if we had access. Therefore he will contact the press about carrying Libertarian syndicated columnist Vin Suprinowicz of the Las Vegas *Times Review*.

**Electoral strategy.** Layman absent; no report.

### Old business.

**Electoral campaigns.** The Grindlinger, Roselle, Bacon, Heitner and Derby campaigns were discussed.

**FIJA and Tax Protest Day activities.** Deferred to the State Board meeting.

**Insurance.** The cost to the NJLP of a \$500K general liability policy was quoted at about \$500. Monmouth county has purchased a \$500K policy that covers 12 meetings and 4 special events, such as the county fair (which requires insurance) for \$209. The Steering committee decided not to purchase a policy for the NJLP at this time.

**Liberty Campaign Workshop.** Seventeen NJLP members attended the outstanding course taught by political consultant Sal Guzzetta in Harrisburg, PA.

### New business.

**Health reform.** The Steering Committee will put together a kit consisting of masters of the ISIL brochure "The Clinton Health Care Disaster", a Project Healthy Choice brochure (prepared by the LP) with NJLP membership form,

a resolution to Chambers of Commerce urging support of our health reform proposals, and an action flyer explaining what should be done. The kit will be distributed to the counties for implementation. RESOLVED, that the NJLP spend \$5 for the purchase of the ISIL brochure mentioned above. PASSED.—RESOLVED, that the NJLP spend no more than \$20 for the purchase of high quality masters of Project Healthy Choice brochures. PASSED.

### Announcements.

**Candidates.** Austin Lett is running for Chatham Township Committee, Morris county.

**Second Amendment.** The NJLP will meet with the Coalition of N.J. Sportsmen on a date to be determined.

**Next meeting.** The State Board will meet at 1 PM June 18 at Alexander's Inn in Cape May.

**Lending library.** Thanks to the generosity of Ray Babecki we now own a copy of the NRA video tape *Learn Gun Safety with Eddie Eagle*.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:44 PM.

**INSTRUCTIONS:** This is your ballot to elect County Representatives to the NJLP State Board. To vote, find your county on this page and circle the name of the person you want to be your County Representative. If you don't want a Representative to the State Board, circle NOTA, which stands for "None Of The Above". Don't want the nominated person? Write in the name of the person you DO want. And if your county is not listed, write it in along with a name on the line provided.

Then take the ballot and fold it so that your selection is not visible. Seal it by stapling or taping it shut and place it in the voting envelope provided. Make sure that the county indicated on the label of the envelope agrees with the county you selected on the ballot. If it does not agree, change the county on the label so it does agree. This is a secret ballot, so the envelope will be used to validate the ballot for each county before they are opened and counted. Any ballot marked for a county different from its envelope will be disqualified when the votes for that county are counted.

Send the voting envelope and ballot to the NJLP, P.O. Box 56, Tennent, NJ 07763, by July 31, 1994. It must be received by then in order to be counted. Results of this election will be announced in August.

can't Libertarians understand and accept this fact? Sure the rules are tough, sure they are stacked against us. But wishing it wasn't so won't make anything change.

Liz claims that Libertarians elected to office won't fail or disappoint. I wish it were so! *I regard Dick Zimmer as an elected libertarian (though a republican) and the guy disappears me on a weekly basis.*

She claims that we don't need experience because the greenest of us can detect a waste of tax dollars or a violation of human rights. *Yes, but what are we prepared to do about it?*

It is much harder to dismantle government, than to build it. This means we need to be more qualified, not less. Simply knowing that a bomb is ticking does not qualify you to defuse it. If you think it does, well then, pardon me as

I back way up while you attempt it.

The Reagan Administration attempted to "deregulate" banking. Unfortunately they cut the wrong wire first, and now there are legions of people claiming that "deregulation" doesn't work. Sure it does. But you have to know what you are doing. Do we?

What proof do we have that we do? Why do some libertarians feel that they are qualified to be in Congress when they have never held any public office? Would they perform surgery without studying first? What makes them think that applying a scalpel to government is any easier than applying one to a human being? It may be even more difficult, and certainly more dangerous.

If we are going to be an effective force for change we need to get elected to office.

That requires a strategy.

Running for higher office is more difficult than running for local office, and requires more experience than we possess.

We need to get into the system at the bottom level, learn as we go, and struggle to train a large number of candidates both to run for public office, and to hold it.

I am not suggesting that these candidates need to learn how to curry favor with the populace using the typical strategies of our opponents.

I am suggesting that before you attempt to defuse an atomic bomb, you should know how it is constructed, and have some experience defusing other less dangerous weapons.

If you think that all that is needed to be a good public servant is a good heart and a good head, you're in for a major disappointment. It requires much more.

For the most part we don't

even yet know what.

Let's get to work finding out. Let's not fool ourselves into thinking that you can be a doctor without attending med school, nor should we believe that we can never be doctors. Many of the libertarians I know assume one or the other. Either they think that our task is impossible and give up without ever having attempted it, or they think they already possess the skills they need to succeed.

Thankfully this attitude is changing. Could it be we are finally growing up?
