It looks like we could put on one heck of a convention--cocktail party, three meals, three speakers, two workshops, a panel on national defense-for \$50 to \$60. We got good press coverage in 1979 despite its being an off-year. And the rooms are at their lowest rates because it's their off-season.

I welcome whatever assistance or comments are offered to produce a successful convention to celebrate our 10th year of existence.

### NATCOM ALREADY AT WORK ON 1982 ELECTIONS

The news media has generally viewed third parties as a phenomenon with a four year cycle. Think of them as a plague of four year locusts that cause great aggravation in years evenly divisible by four (eg. 1976, 1980, 1984...) but disappear in between.

Not so the Libertarian Party. While we in New Jersey are working on the 1981 races for governor and local offices, Libertarians across the country are making big plans for 1982. Dick Randolph has already begun a serious bid for Governor of Alaska in next year's race. National LP Director Eric O'Keefe projects the party will field even more candidates in 1982 than in record-breaking 1980. Now, a special committee has been set up by the Libertarian National Committee to spearhead the 1982 Congressional races.

The Libertarian Congressional Committee had an open meeting in Washington, DC in July to discuss its goals and strategy for 1982. I attended to contribute my own ideas (after all, I was a Congressional candidate in 1978 in NJ's 6th District), but mostly to find out what's going on.

different Several viewpoints and strategies were aired at the meeting, but οf most those attending agreed on two key points. First, we will be running a lot more candidates for federal office in 1982 than in 1980. Chris Hocker, who has become an expert on ballot

access laws, feels that we can field at least 250 candidates. (Incidentally, he is assuming a full federal slate in New Jersey.) Some people mentioned even higher numbers, possible with greater effort on ballot drives.

The second item of general agreement was that most of the money raised should be spent on nationwide massmedia advertising, where it can help all LP candidates. Tom Palmer has contacted the TV networks about purchasing program time next year, at the same sort of cheap rates that were available to the Clark campaign last year. Some other possibilities that were discussed: nationwide radio network spots, regular TV commercials, and a halfhour program on election eve.

The more mundane matters the campaign were discussed, too. Like how to raise the money to pay for the media advertising (would you believe Alternative '82?), research on issues, and a special newsletter. It will take more meetings, more planning, and more informaget all of this tion to worked out--but I left the meeting excited about the big plans for 1982. Start thinkabout running ing Congress!
