Scalpers perform a service

The News last month printed a letter by Salvatore Cannata calling for the end to ticket scalping at all events. I must dissent.

So-called ticket scalpers perform a service, which people are willing to purchase, otherwise there would not be any ticket scalpers. Most of us don't want to take off time from work to go

buy concert tickets or else we just plain hate to stand in line. Here is where the "scalper" performs his function by giving up his or her time and purchasing tickets for resale. They are actually saving us time and money we otherwise would have to do without. The "scalped" price is simply the service fee we pay for avoiding lost time and long lines.

Buying a scalped ticket is a purely voluntary, peaceful act between two willing people in the best traditions of laissez faire. The last thing we need is another round of Big Brother helping us protect us from ourselves.
